We will properly decommission your PCs by following the government datawiping standards of the Department of Defense (DoD) 5220.22M and a Certificate of Destruction is issued upon request. Instead of ending up in a landfill, the refurbished computers will be supplied to disadvantaged communities that need access to the benefits of technology that they cannot currently afford.
